John Painter operates Painterland Farms in Westfield, PA with his two brothers and his mother. Five generations of the family currently work on the organic dairy and organic hay farm, where they farm 5,500 acres. Painter is the District 5 State Director for the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau, representing Potter, McKean, Tioga, Bradford, and Sullivan counties. He is also a member of the Potter/Tioga Farm Bureau.

Jeff Barnes is a seventh-generation farmer, operating Maple Knoll Farms in Millerton, PA. Maple Knoll is a 260-cow dairy, operated by Barnes, his wife, and his brother. Fifteen years ago, Maple Knoll received the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau Achievement award, and was ranked in the top five for the American Farm Bureau. Barnes is the Vice President of the Potter/Tioga Farm Bureau and also serves as a volunteer fireman for the Millerton Fire Company.

"After the expansion of our geographic footprint into the south-central part of the state, our agricultural lending arm has continued to strengthen," said President and CEO Randall E. Black. "With the help of talented advisory board members, who serve as the eyes and ears of our markets, we're confident our growth in the agricultural sector will continue."
