Grilled Corn Salad

This flavorful corn salad is the perfect addition to your summer picnic.

4 ears corn, shucked and grilled 1/4 cup toasted nuts (walnuts or pecans) roughly chopped

1 cup tender herbs (such as cilantro, basil, or parsley), chopped

1/4 cup Parmesan Juice of ½ lime 1 tablespoon olive oil Salt & Pepper

1/2 cup pickled onions

- Remove kernels from cob and place in a large bowl

Supporting the Pennsylvania Friends of Agriculture Foundation

Pennsylvania Friends of Agriculture Foundation, a charitable organization supported by the PA Farm Bureau, works to enlighten the public about farming and agriculture, create educational programs for children who may have no exposure to agriculture, train teachers on agricultural concepts while helping them meet their own continuing education requirements, fund scholarships for post-secondary agriculture studies, and promote career opportunities in agriculture.

Their Mobile Ag Ed Science Lab program has brought hands-on science lessons to over 1 million students across Pennsylvania since its start in 2003. The program, now in its 14th year, uses hands-on, STEMbased lessons to teach students about the importance of agriculture through the scientific method.

The Foundation also offers a variety of scholarship opportunities. The E. Chester Heim Scholarship is available to students at Penn State and Delaware Valley who are pursuing agricultural education. The Richard W. Newpher/Farm Bureau Endowed Scholarship is for graduate students at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Veterinary Medicine who are dedicated to large animal studies.

Their newest endeavor, Pennsylvania's state-wide Ag Literacy Week, brings Agriculture into the classroom in a whole new way. FFA and 4H groups, as well as those who work directly in the Ag industry, volunteer as readers. The students also participate in activities that reinforce the concepts from the story, including the source of their food and careers in Agriculture.

At FCCB, we are proud supporters of the Pennsylvania Friends of Agriculture Foundation and are happy to make a \$10,000 donation to support this great cause. Recently, some of our employees and their children toured the Mobile Ag Lab and stopped to pose for a photo.

Karns Grocery Chain Contracts With Pennsylvania Beef Farmers

The mission of Keystone Farm Future is to help sustain small

Pennsylvania farms by driving the sale of local meat to PA grocery stores. They recently announced the successful launch of their program in Karns Quality Foods Supermarkets.

Keystone Farm Future has gained agreement from a large grocery store chain to pilot their program in 29 stores in Central PA. They also currently have 6 more supermarkets who are in the process of signing onto the program.

To meet the new demand, they are working with the Northern Tier Grow Ag Committee to connect them with farmers in the Northern Tier who can meet the qualifications. Several key considerations include travel distance between one of two processors currently located in Westfield, PA and Loganton, PA, and the ability to have 40 square feet to accommodate a pot belly of 62 heads.

Biosecurity UPDATE

According to Lancaster Farming, outbreaks of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) A(H5N1) in Pennsylvania Buffer Area (PBA) and the Line of this spring lead to the depopulation of 4 million chickens and ducks – 10% of losses nationwide. Summer is here and rising temperatures have reduced the spread but when fall arrives with cooler weather, migration south will begin bringing with it a potential for a spike in cases. Poultry farmers should remain vigilant in their biosecurity measures and train employees to make biosecurity a part of their routines.

include actions related to the Perimeter Separation (LOS).

The PBA is the outside line to the farm. This is the point where you will disinfect vehicles coming onto the farm. A sanitation station with weatherproof storage would be ideal. The PBA would also be the point where a garden shed or special drop box can be placed so that loss of a flock and the associated lost deliveries can be made securely.

The PBA recommends Biosecurity Plans The LOS is where you are about to enter the room where the birds are housed – where you try to separate whatever is outside from what is inside. This area is used to put on poultry house clothing, change shoes to house-specific shoes, and disinfect hands and feet before entering.

> The investment in a good biosecurity program is much less expensive than the income. Plan ahead today to keep your flock and your operation healthy!
