The group organizes a Mobile Ag Lab, which visits schools teaching children about Agriculture. Since its inception, the Mobile Ag Lab has reached over one million students, and has visited 96% of the counties in Pennsylvania. The Mobile Ag Lab's visits are funded by donors like First Citizens.
