First Citizens Success Merits Recognition





...and that's something we don't take lightly. In December First Citizens donated \$200,000 to educational programs across the state. We understand the impact a quality education can have on the future of our communities. We're proud to play a role in creating tomorrow's leaders, whether they follow a path in agriculture, medicine, technology, education, a skilled trade or business.

In the Northern Tier, organizations receiving funds include BLaST Intermediate Unit 17, the Potter County Education Council, and the Tioga County Foundation.

BLaST is an education service agency that assists school districts in Bradford, Lycoming, Sullivan and Tioga Counties with funding initiatives that would otherwise need to come out of taxpayer pockets.

The Potter County Education Council acts as a liaison matching area educational resources to individual needs. They offer accredited courses, skills training, seminars, workshops, and career and financial counseling.

Similarly, the Tioga County Foundation serves to recruit, train, and develop individuals to participate in community leadership activities throughout the county.

Seven organizations in our South-Central footprint also received funds as part of our recent donation. They include the Cedar Foundation, the Falcon Foundation, the Northern Lebanon Education Foundation, the Hempfield Foundation, the Lancaster County Career & Technology Foundation and the Manheim Central Foundation for Educational Enrichment. The core commonality of these groups is their dedication to enriching the education, values and cultural experiences of youth. They strive to help students achieve educational excellence and stimulate innovative programs in the classroom.

Agriculture is one of Pennsylvania's leading industries. Organizations such as the Center for Dairy Excellence and PA Friends of Agriculture share our commitment to ensuring agriculture will succeed for future generations. They fund programs that cultivate the dairy industry through youth development, building customer awareness and providing continuing education in dairy-related fields.
